HRMFFA Update – RDML Craig Quigley

- 2020 Legislative Priorities draft out for formal Board approval by tomorrow or the next day
 - After approval Rick and I will take it to DC and hand deliver to all six of the Congressional
 offices
 - This document consists of the items we are asking their help with during this legislative cycle.
 - We will share with both MEDAC's
- We attempted to get a State level version of the Defense Community Infrastructure Program
 - This will provide grant money to communities that host military installations with a community match for a project outside the fence line that would benefit the military mission inside the fence line
 - We asked for \$10 million and did not get it
 - There were 9.4 billion worth of requested budget amendments
 - We did not make the cut but will try again next year
 - Going on Thursday to the Washington Navy Yard to meet with NAV-C
 - We will be there for the Maritime industrial base ecosystem initiative
 - Hear the Navy's vision on how they are going to dig itself out of the hole of ship sustainment, modernization, and repair
 - We will share with them our vision on how Hampton Roads can help them do that

SECNAV Education Initiative – Bob Clark, ODU

Kathy Owens – introduced Bob Clark, ODU Liaison to give the group updates

- Kathy shared a handout with information and talking points on the initiative of excellence
- A letter of proposal was sent to the SECNAV and the CNO's Office as to what we can do here in Hampton Roads to encompass all the educational institutions together
- We have held meetings with the John Kroger, Chief Learning Officer, and the staff to share our ideas and what we can do as a team to educate our sailors
- They were very receptive to the conversation and the President said he wanted to partner with us as well as others
- Announcements have been made concerning the Navy Community College at Quantico
- Process is in place to hire a President
- We should try to invite him to one of our joint MEDAC meetings to pitch him as to why it would be a great idea to bring the Navy University System to Hampton Roads
- We relayed to him we have the programs here to move from Associates up to a master's degree
- We communicated the community college is already on the East Coast at Quantico so there
 might be a chance for them to move the Navy University System over to the west coast
- It is the hopes that the Universities could carry the accreditation in case something happened to the Navy installation.
- Expecting an RFP for the University System to come out some time in March or April
- We will ask for input from the MEDAC members for this document for the region as a whole
- There are talking points on the back of the handout for MEDAC members to share (see attached)
- Hampton Roads has infrastructure and ability to make this happen
- We should plan to invite SECNAV to our next Joint MEDAC meeting
- We will know more when the RFI comes out
- We need a better plan to get our sailors educated

757 Tech Bridge - CDR Bobby Hanvey

- Elizabeth Dietzmann introduced Bobby Hanvey to share NavalX and the Tech Bridge program
- NavalX is the Assistant SECNAV for Research and Development Acquisition
- Biggest challenges is the operational side of the Navy is solving short term problems
- Another challenge is this region does not have the best history with partnering with other organizations and cities to meet the needs
- We are looking at inside the Navy and outside the Navy
- We want to take information already out there, put it together within the groups and implement the strategies
- To maintain and succeed, we need operational aid

- Reaching to find out how small businesses can work with the Navy instead of just the large companies
- Getting more consistent to deliver projects more timely
- o Ideas to get classified information out to the small business community and industries
- Looking to provide a public office where the DON can meet with others to discuss projects, collaboration, workshops, and events
- The difference in this is the Navy is reaching out to the communities, so the longevity will have a better chance of surviving as we would be joining efforts already in place
- Navy staff are being appointed to this effort so it will continue
- Tech groups have been established
- Continued discussion on the Warfare gap issues
- Short term solutions are most important at this point
- It was asked the MEDAC group be added to the email group for NavalX and the Tech Bridge initiative
- MEDAC members were asked to share with Bobby who he needs to reach out to and give him any information that may assist the initiative to move forward
